oticing that only 18% of applicants for junior research positions were women, Shannon O'Mara decided to do something about it. In 2015, she founded the firm's Undergraduate Women's Investment Network, which offers year-long academic mentorships to female college students.

Why are young women still not entering the field of investment management?

Ms. O'Mara offered some thoughts:

- They were turned off by the Great Recession.
- "Some remember the global financial crisis and its effect on their parents and think, 'I'm not sure I want to get involved,'" she said.
  - They don't know what investment management is.
- There are so few other women in undergraduate finance classes.

"We're trying to catch them in sophomore or junior year because it's that key decision-making time for them," Ms. O'Mara said.
