The Composite includes all discretionary accounts with market values greater than €20 million managed by Loomis Sayles that seek to add value for clients primarily through seeking to generate consistent excess returns versus the benchmark utilizing a conservative alpha investment process. This process combines a top-down market view with bottom-up corporate fundamental analysis whereby ESG is fully integrated. This results in an actively managed, diversified strategy, with strong beta-driven risk orientation and uncorrelated positions. The Composite invests primarily in euro-denominated, investment grade corporate bonds. Accounts may allow up to 10% in BB-rated securities and up to 10% in non-EUR denominated securities, albeit hedged for currency and interest rate risk. Portfolio duration is managed within a narrow range to the benchmark. The Composite inception date is April 1, 2021. The Composite was created in 2023.
