

### A Note from the Founder

After managing the Loomis Sayles Undergraduate Women's Investment Network (UWIN) program virtually for 2+ years, it's been so wonderful to be back together, engaging and connecting in the same space. Despite the challenges of the pandemic, UWIN continued to make progress in its mission to inspire, educate and recruit undergraduate women into investment management through internship and mentorship opportunities. Just look at our good news on pages 11-13! I'm pleased to share that our UWIN alumni now total almost 200, and with this year's group of participants, we'll soon be at 220. We've also expanded our reach to include more schools; new this year is Harvard College after welcoming students from Stonehill College and Tufts University last year.

As we continue our journey, we embrace the motto of the University of Rochester, my alma mater, "meliora" which means "ever better," as we strive to effectively adapt to this hybrid world and serve and engage the Gen Z population entering the workforce. We now host a mix of virtual and in-person development and technical skills workshops throughout the school year. We've also made efforts to stay better connected in the world of social media with the launch of an Instagram page. Please follow us at @UWIN LoomisSayles, where you can find highlights of the program, spotlights on UWIN participants and alums, updates on our workshops, and advice for young women interested in careers in investing. We look forward to seeing you online!



To help sustain the connection of our growing network of more than 200 women, many of whom are pursuing careers in investment management, we launched the Inspiring Speaker Series in 2022 which provides a forum to maintain connection between UWIN participants and Loomis Sayles. The UWIN program partners with Loomis Sayles employee resource groups to host speakers who provide unique perspectives in their areas of expertise. In November, UWIN teamed up with our Women@Work Early Career Professionals group to co-host Susan MacKenty Brady, CEO of the of The Simmons University Institute for Inclusive Leadership, who shared perspectives from her best-selling book "Arrive and Thrive," specifically investing in your best self. One UWIN alum shared with me, "The webinar with Susan was excellent! I have pages of notes and feel empowered to bring my best self to the table!"

In early 2023, UWIN teamed up with the firm's Mentorship Program to host Rosina Racioppi, CEO of WOMEN Unlimited, Inc., who shared her insights on the importance of developing relationships, networks and mentorship opportunities, drawing from her book "Relationships Matter." This event will be co-hosted with Valor, the Loomis Sayles veterans' group.

I enjoy hearing from current students, alums and mentors throughout the year. In the spirit of "meliora," we gather feedback and reflections from our participants throughout each program. You can see the tangible impact UWIN is having on three women in our most recently completed program who provided the following reflections:

"I think that this program has fantastic workshops and a great curriculum to offer. ## Inside a Mentorship

How often and where do you typically meet?

Caroline: Preston and I meet for a half hour either 1 to 2 times a month. Our meeting is usually done over a phone call or facetime. Although, we are hoping to be able to schedule an in person meeting during a workshop day when I come to visit the office in the following months of the mentorship program! Preston and I communicate often what date/time works best for our schedules in order for us to be most productive with our time connecting. Preston has been very flexible with my changing schedule. For instance, I was able to reach out to him whenever I needed any advice whether it was for a specific interview or for help with revising my resume.

What is your biggest takeaway from this experience?

Caroline: My biggest takeaway from this experience is that you get out what you put in. It is inevitable that some setbacks will come your way as you are trying to accomplish the goals you set out for. Although, you can't let those setbacks stop you from putting in the work and striving for success.

Preston: Communication is vital for getting the most out of the mentor/mentee relationship. Working with Caroline has been easy because she communicates her needs and goals, and asks questions.

What is the best advice your mentor has given you?

Caroline: The best advice Preston has given me over the course of this experience was to always be genuine whether I was preparing for an interview or seeking networking opportunities. Preston taught me that if you are prepared there is no reason to try to oversell. I have learned that interviews should not feel robotic and should instead carry on as a genuine conversation. In addition, another tip I learned was to bring something to the table that will make you stand out when speaking with new people in the industry. This can be a project or writing piece you are most proud of that exhibits the relevant skills you possess that qualify you for a position.

As a mentor, what skills did you feel were most important to share with your mentee?

Preston: Be yourself! Interviewers want someone who is competent but they also want someone who will fit with coworkers from a personality and culture standpoint. Do your homework first but then try to let your interpersonal attributes shine during the interview process.

What was your favorite workshop to attend thus far?

Caroline: My favorite workshop so far would be the November workshop that focused on how to make your resume and cover letter stand out and a session on communication. During the resume and cover letter portion we were able to ask critical questions about the rights and wrongs of the job application and interview process. This was very helpful to hear feedback from professionals in the industry who have been on the other end of the process. I really enjoyed working with the communications consultants because this session was very interactive and allowed me to self-reflect on my own communication skills. We did exercises that made everyone step out of their comfort zone a little bit and gain feedback and tips on how to improve for the next time we will have to speak in a professional environment.

What is the most important characteristic a mentee/mentor could portray prior to entering this program?

Caroline: As a mentee, I believe the most important characteristic to have before joining the mentorship program would be to always be curious. I feel I have learned so much from this experience by simply asking questions and inquiring about different career paths that may interest me. I shared with Preston that I am not quite set on a certain career path just yet, so when talking about different opportunities we were able to keep my options open. This sparked many unforeseen conversations and experiences.

Preston: Take initiative, especially in subjects you are interested in. Simply applying for the mentorship shows initiative in that Caroline was willing to participate in a program on top of her studies and athletic obligations. From there, take advantage of the resources of UWIN. Caroline has access to professionals with decades of experience in the capital markets. Ask questions, ask for introductions, squeeze everything you can out of Loomis. It will pay off down the road. Networking is an important skill and this program is a great start.



# What's New at Loomis Sayles?

Loomis Sayles continues to expand its employee resource groups (ERGs)!

The Early Career Professionals (ECP) was created in 2022 as a group within Loomis Sayles' Women@Work ERG. ECP's mission is to collaborate, foster and retain a diverse community of talent through networking, career development, and engagement opportunities.

In addition to hosting several lunch and learns with senior leaders, a social pickle ball event, and a golf lesson, ECP co-hosted two fireside chats with other ERGs at Loomis Sayles. Collaborating with the Allies ERG, ECP co-hosted the authors of "Undiversified: The Big Gender Short in Investment Management," a book we highly recommend! This was followed by a partnership with the UWIN program to host the inaugural UWIN Inspiring Speaker Series webinar event with leadership expert Susan Brady. Susan is the CEO of Simmons University Institute for Inclusive Leadership and the Deloitte Ellen Gabriel Chair for Women and Leadership.
